# Proud, Puzzled and Promising

*This is my body... This is my blood - Mark 14: 22, 24*

## Proud

I'm so very proud of this congregation—having just returned from an extended vacation and taking time to reflect on where God is leading us—I thanked God for each of you. In our absence, Dee and I felt you carried out ministry very well. I've come back to numerous examples of teamwork and ministry moving forward with excellence. I especially am indebted to Linda and David for leading worship, Sue Byers caring for the needs of many, and all the ministry teams that functioned with distinction. As Jesus once said, "Well done, good and faithful servant."

## Puzzled

Like you, I'm puzzled as to what happened with our offering envelopes. I talked to the supplier today and she assures us they will leave the plant by the end of the week. She says there was a problem with one of their suppliers. I thank you for your patience during this delay. I want to reassure you that your leadership team will continue to work diligently until this is resolved.

## Promising

I'm so very excited about what lies ahead. The leadership of this church continues to work meticulously behind the scenes in developing a comprehensive plan to implement ideas that surfaced during our Home Gatherings. I'm encouraged that we narrowed the gap in our deficit at the end of the year and am confident we will get into the black soon. Lent begins Feb 22 with another promising series based on Adam Hamilton's book, *24 Hours that Changed the World*. We will work through the Gospel of Mark's Passion Narrative as we look at the final 24 Hours of Jesus' life. There is a companion DVD that would make an excellent follow-up study for Small Groups after we complete 40 DITW. All in all, I believe 2012 is very promising.

## Last Supper

The Lenten Season begins and ends for us with Holy Communion. We remember Jesus' words of institution—*This is my body ... This is my blood*. I'm proud to be a follower of Jesus Christ and want to live my life in a way that makes God proud to call me His. I'm puzzled that God would love me so much that He would die to save me—Help me Lord to never forget that it cost you everything! The future is promising as we live out our faith. Our promising future calls us to witness to our faith [worship], grow in our faith [small group], and serve others in ministry and mission [service]. As we come to the Lord's Table, let's remember the *24 Hours that Changed the World* and make God proud by truly being the church—serving him with heart, head and hands.

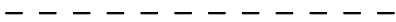

### **Simplify your offering –**

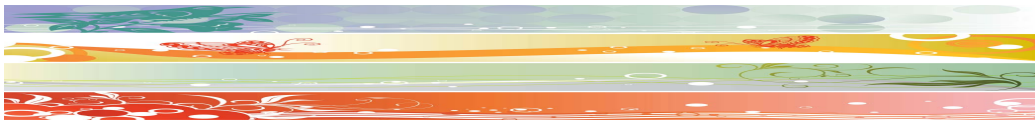
We apologize for the delay of getting offering envelopes out to you. Delays with ordering and delivery held the office staff up from this important endeavor. A way that you could ease this issue and prevent future issues would be to go with an Electronic Transfer of Funds. We have been accepting ACH payments for several years now. There are quite a few who do this on a weekly or monthly basis. It is easy. It is also manageable. Perhaps you get paid monthly or receive stipends that vary from week to week or month to month. You can have a specific amount withdrawn from your account at specific times. If you should fall into a period where things are tight, just notify the office and let them know that you want to withhold your transfer for a specific period of time. Many folk have optioned to have a set amount withdrawn / transferred and then supplement their giving as they are able. There are pamphlets in the foyer on the shelves above the coat racks, so that you can read more about this as well as an application for the office to set this up with your bank. Please consider this “green friendly” method of giving to our church.
